They must meet the following geographic criteria in their selections:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> At least three of the eight courses (nine credits) must be in U.S. history, and At least four of the eight courses (twelve credits) must be in European, Asian, Latin American, or African history. <p>Students must also address the following criteria when selecting their eight electives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Two of the eight electives (six credits) may be lower-level courses, though the department will only accept the survey of East Asian Civilization, HIST 103 (HIST 247 at MC), and one-half of the survey of U.S. history, HIST 101 or 102 (HIST 200 or HIST 201 at MC), as lower-level electives, and these classes cannot be counted as electives if they are used to fulfill the required classes listed above, and Students must take at least six of the eight electives (18 credits) at the upper level (courses numbered 300 or above), and Students must take at least three of the eight electives (nine credits) at the 400 level.
